SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

Isaiah emphasizes that from the desert to the mountains, all people must prepare for “the glory of the Lord to be revealed.” Rather than looking only at God’s power, Isaiah focuses on God’s kindness, comparing it to a shepherd who feeds and cares for his flock.

Second Reading: 2 Peter 3:8-14

For those who are impatient for the Second Coming, Peter explains that time is different to God than to people. He reminds them that they should be grateful for the extra time to prepare, and concentrate on striving to become all that God would want them to be.

Gospel: Mark 1:1-8

In this passage, John the Baptist stressed the importance of the coming of the Messiah. He acknowledged that he was only the messenger, and unfit to “stoop and untie his sandal straps.” John urged them to prepare for one far holier than he, who would walk among them.

11:30 SOLEMN MASS

The liturgical constitution of Vatican II, Sacrosanctum Councilium, mandates that every parish have at least one solemn, sung Mass every Sunday. At Holy Rosary, this has customarily been satisfied at the 11:30 Mass, where we are grateful to have our choir usually sing. Over the course of the last two years, we have also implemented (very successfully) the Second Vatican Council's mandate that the entire congregation learn to chant the commons of the Mass (Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, et cetera) in Greek and Latin by introducing the use of the Mass of the Angels for most of our liturgical year. Next, we will conform to the rules of the Official Roman Missal (issued right after the Council and reissued in 2011) that presume that Mass is celebrated by the priest and people ad orientem, which is to say, all facing God in the same direction.

This change is one very much encouraged by Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI (see his book, Spirit of the Liturgy) and by the present Prefect of the Vatican Office for Divine Worship, Cardinal Robert Sarah, of Guinea. All these things are done in hope that our parish grows closer to God and thereby love Him and one another better for the salvation of our souls.
