TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Ezekiel 18:25-28

Ezekiel reminds the people that if a sinner turns away from his iniquity, he will live, not die.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:1-11

Paul urges the converts at Philippi to be united in spirit and ideals, avoiding rivalry and dissension. He ends with the beautiful hymn extolling the humility and sacrifice of Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 21:28-32

Jesus speaks words of rebuke to the chief priests and the elders because they are not believing the teachings of John the Baptist. He warns them that tax collectors and prostitutes, who do believe John, will enter the Kingdom of God before them.

Religious Education (CCD)

Registration for the 2017-18 year is open. You may register in the Rectory. Fees are \$75 for one child and \$100 for families. If you are new to the program we need a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate.

Classes have already started on **Saturdays**, from 9AM to 11AM, but you may still register.

Registration Forms are available in the **Rectory**.

Children who attend public school, First Grade through Junior High school should be registered in our Religious Education Program. These classes include preparation for the Sacraments and are held weekly from September to May.

Notes on Music

We welcome back the Adult & Children's Choirs this Sunday. Both choirs are still accepting new members. For further details, please speak with the organist Eva Sze after any weekend Mass.

In the last two years, the Entrance, Offertory and Communion Antiphons were chanted by the Adult Choir at the Sunday 11:30AM Mass. As of this fall, they are chanted at all weekend Masses as an effort to move toward the goal of singing the Mass (as opposed to singing at Mass). Prescribed in the Roman Missal, these antiphons are integral parts of the liturgy and complement the readings and prayers of the day. The seasonal Marian antiphon, Salve Regina, is sung at the end of all weekend Masses during October, the month of the Rosary. It is not a recessional hymn. The faithful are encouraged to venerate the Blessed Mother through the singing of this antiphon.
