First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Moses explains to the people that a prophet will
come from among them, and that they should listen
to this prophet's words, for God has told him of this
prophet. God also tells Moses that anyone who
pretends to speak in his words, or speaks in the name
of other gods shall die.

Extraordinary Form Mass at 1PM

We welcome Fr. Robert Rodriguez of St. Brenda-St. Ann Parish in the Bronx to be the celebrant for the 1PM Mass in the Extraordinary Form today, known as Septuagesima Sunday. It marks the beginning of the pre-Lenten season. The liturgical color is violet; the Gloria and the Alleluia are omitted.

The congregation is encouraged to sing the Ordinary of the Mass (Kyrie, Credo, Sanctus and Agnus Dei) the schola will chant the Mass Proper or the appointed text for the day (Introit, Gradual, Tract, Offertory and Communion) as well as two motets related to the readings. The schola sings on behalf of the congregation, though everyone is called to participate actively by listening and reflecting on the sacred texts, whether sung or read.
